

- 550 + Senior Volunteers provided 196,287 hours of service to local homes, schools, senior centers, hospices, museums, and local non-profit agencies
- 75 seniors (100% with psychological or physical impairments) were welcomed into a safe and engaging environment at our Elder Day Stay center which provided 57,000 hours of respite care for caregivers
- ECS responded to nearly 3,000 assistance and referral calls and filled 1,587 requests for material aid (wheelchairs, walkers, food, fans, and other personal care items)
- Meals on Wheels has delivered over 4,000,000 meals in our area





We maintain strong fiscal policies to ensure the integrity and longevity of these programs.



FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP

Elder Care Services is able to offer quality services to our seniors through vigilant grant pursuits supplemented by generous donors and volunteers. 2017 boasted disciplined expense control, \$574,000 of in-kind donations, and \$99,000 in net investment gains. Thanks to the contributions of the community and efforts of staff, 2017 finished with a solid increase in net assets of \$105,000.
