


## **GENDER**

33.2% of our clients identify as male.



#### **SENIOR HIGHLIGHT**

Barbara, a client in our Meals on Wheels program, has a passion for the arts. She uses her projects to express her emotions with those closest to her and to release her feelings personally. As a self-taught artist with multiple mental disorders, Barbara thrives with this method of expression.

In March of 2020, Barbara reached out to Elder Care Services about receiving assistance through multiple services. With the COVID-19 pandemic, many seniors were left socially isolated and unable to leave their homes due to increased health risks. Like many older people in the Big Bend and beyond, Barbara was experiencing both physical and mental hardships due to the pandemic. Concurrently, she was also going through a complicated legal process with no support around her.

A case manager was assigned to Barbara and a thorough screening was performed to identify her unique needs. With Barbara being unable to leave her home, she began to receive full meals through the Meals on Wheels program and additional shopping assistance. Throughout the pandemic, her case manager has been working closely with her to assess her needs and give support throughout her legal process. When Barbara was in need of basic household appliances, the case manager assisted in finding the necessary goods. Ongoing and frequent communication between Barbara and her case manager ensured that the care plan continued to be the best support for her needs. Throughout time, they have established a strong tie that goes beyond her services.

She also started attending weekly counseling sessions with Elder Care Services' on-staff therapist. Barbara made her mental and physical health a priority by keeping her body and mind sound during the pandemic.

With these life-sustaining services, Barbara was able to live comfortably in her own home during the height of the pandemic. The compassionate care she received from Elder Care Services was a beacon of hope that showed her resilience during the COVID-19 outbreak.



## **OUR SERVICES**



#### **Nutrition Services**

Meals on Wheels (hot & frozen) are delivered on weekdays to homebound seniors and to 8 congregate meal sites.



#### Elder Day Stay

EDS provides continuous care to adults with physical or cognitive concerns as well as respite for caregivers. Monday through Friday, 7:30am to 5:30pm.



#### Senior Volunteer Program

Seniors 55 years or older are placed in vital volunteer roles that enrich the quality of life of the senior and their community.



#### Senior Outreach Services

SOS Specialists are the first contact for seniors seeking help and may provide material aid as well as answer questions and connect seniors to appropriate resources.



#### In-Home Services

In-Home Services care for frail, functionally impaired and homebound seniors as an alternative to nursing home placement.

52 seniors were cared for at Elder Day Stay




2,636 clients were served among all programs
